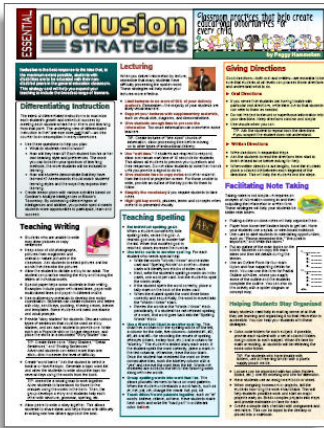

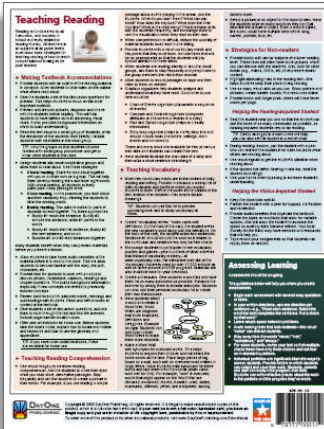


From Peggy Hammeken, author of several best-selling books on Inclusion, comes this laminated card summarizing the best-of-the-best strategies for inclusive instruction.

On this amazing 8½" x 11" card you will find a broad spectrum of inclusion strategies.

The front of the card covers in detail these topics:

- **Differentiation of Instruction** - key questions to ask yourself that will help you differentiate your lessons; ways to create lesson plans that will reach wider skills & talents in your classes.
- **Teaching Writing** - alternates to writing; stimulating writing; use of dictation; multisensory strategies; story starters; word banks; peer writing.
- **Lecturing** - supporting lectures; processing time; wait time; managing student note taking; handling vocabulary; key words.
- **Spelling** - goal setting; index card strategies; word list charts; word families; difficult word patterns.
- **Giving Directions** - oral directions; written directions.
- **Facilitating Note Taking** - organizing note by time; best paper; cuing students; outlining; outline forms.
- **Organization** - folder management; locker management; assignment books; estimating scope of assignments; checklists.



The back of the card has a huge section on Reading. Addressed in this section are these topics:

- **Textbook Accommodations** - outlines; lists of discussion questions; previewing materials; group reading options; cooperative reading groups; using audio cassettes; student-adult interactions; modifications of font qualities; home-study options.
- **Reading Comprehension** - visual imagery; managing quantity of material; list of key points; using paraphrasing; student-recorded passages; graphic organizers; using student-made illustrations.
- **Vocabulary** - weekly lists; vocabulary review; puzzles and games; use of thesaurus; word webs; word wells; use of images to increase vocabulary.
- **Strategies for Non-readers** - highlighting; visual aids; print size considerations.
- **Strategies for Hearing-impaired students** - student seating considerations; creating student pairs; visual signals; use of hands and gestures.
- **Strategies for Vision-impaired students** - lighting; peer support; use of audio.

Also on the back of the card is a section on **Assessing Learning**, including how to begin assessment; sentence structure considerations; spacing problems; words to avoid; adjusting questions; using portfolios.
