Also included are instructional techniques, tools and forms that maximize the opportunities for success for students with autism.

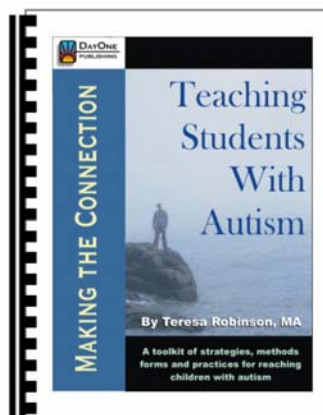
